Description:

The Instrumental Music Teacher and Assistant Marching Band Director is responsible for providing an educational atmosphere where students have the opportunity to fulfill their potential for intellectual, emotional, physical, and psychological growth. This person is responsible for organizing and implementing an instructional program that will result in students achieving academic success in accordance with SPS policies, goals and objectives. This position is for the 2017-18 school year.

> Primary Responsibilities:

- Implements instructional activities that contribute to a climate where students are actively engaged in meaningful learning experiences.
- Identifies, selects, and modifies instructional resources to meet the needs of the students with varying backgrounds, learning styles, and special needs.
- Assists in assessing changing curricular needs and offers plans for improvement.
- Maintains effective and efficient record keeping procedures.
- Provides a positive environment in which students are encouraged to be actively engaged in the learning process.
- Communicates effectively, both orally and in writing, with students, parents, and other professionals on a regular basis.
- Collaborates with peers to enhance the instructional environment.
- Models professional and ethical standards when dealing with students, parents, peers, and community.
- Ensures that student growth and achievement is continuous and appropriate for age group, subject area, and/or program classification.
- Establishes and maintains cooperative working relationships with students, parents, and schools.
- Assumes responsibility for meeting his/her course and school-wide student performance goals.
- Demonstrates gains in student performance.
- Meets professional obligations through efficient work habits such as: meeting deadlines, honoring schedules, coordinating.
- Performs other duties and responsibilities as assigned by their supervisor.
- Assist in building and maintaining a successful and dynamic band program that provides for maximum student participation in a wide variety of activities that bring positive recognition to the music program, school, district, and community.
- Assist in presenting performances of high musical quality in which groups are well-disciplined and make an

exemplary appearance.

- Assist with all after school band rehearsals, and band events.
- Assist the band director with providing students the opportunity to participate and compete in regional and state music events.
- Assist in arranging and composing music.
- Construct and assist with marching drills.
- Encourage and monitor the progress of individual students.
- Have high-stepping marching band experience.
- Participate in the leadership clinic, pre-drill and summer band camp.
- Participate in meetings involving the band boosters and band staff.
- Other duties as assigned by the Principal.
